Badges of Merit 2002

The JDCQ Badge of merit or 'BOM' was introduced by President Peter Tett in 2002.

The aim of this award was to recognise members who have contributed to the club in a variety of ways towards its success but might not necessarily enter competitions, organise events or accrue club points. The aim according to President Peter Tett was to encourage people to become involved, and acknowledge those who regularly assist the club. The BOM is open to everyone, even those currently serving on committees/sub-committees.

The first Badge of Merit awards were offered to eight recipients as recognition of these club members' contributions over time and to launch the new award. Subsequent BOM awards were to be limited to no more than three recipients each year so as not to devalue the award's worth.

Currently the club has several important events ahead in 2015 (40th anniversary) and 2016 (national rally in Qld) the club may need to consider those who contribute to the success of these events in terms of BOM awards. Efforts over time in building these events may need to be observed.

How the Badge of Merit works:

Nomination forms are placed in the magazine and distributed at club meetings and can now be placed on Facebook/ websites and in e-mails.

Club members nominate a person they feel deserves the award and they must provide a brief reason/description why.

Committee takes the nominations and reasons into account selecting the most outstanding.

Not all nominations received will receive an award as there is a limit to three unless it has been a 'special event' year requiring the efforts of many

A person receiving several nominations from a variety of members would certainly be awarded the BOM for that year

Usually a committee member collates and sorts the nominations with a brief description for the nomination for committee to review and badges subsequently given at the end of year Christmas parties.
