
It was wonderful to finally start the driving year even if later than usual. Covid has really messed with our schedules. A few of our regulars still awaiting their boosters even missed this run.



Wild Weather Woes

Now, I mentioned that our intrepid Sunday Run Leaders had been hammered by the storms on the Thursday before our Sunday event.

They were awoken in the dark early hour of 3.10am to the scariest storm they have ever experienced. There was noise from wind and hail and no power so no lights. Their bed got soaked from water coming through the air conditioner and carpets in the guest rooms were drenched. Later they discovered damage to fencing by fallen trees, the pool shade blown off its frame and pierced by fallen tree branch, a big terracotta pot plant smashed, a patio blind damaged and the pool quickly turned very green because of the stripped leaves and no filter.







They lost power for 3 days and had no phone or internet. Most of the streets around were blocked with trees or

water (anyone driving up Steve Irwin Way to the Sunday run could see the immense damage to the trees). Merv managed to get out by a very roundabout way, and a few false starts, to collect their generator from their van which was in for service so thankfully they didn't lose their food supplies.

They also managed to do a recce on Friday afternoon and discovered their proposed route was impassable. Troopers that they are, they emailed me and we talked while they sat on the hill above Tranquil Park to organize Plan B for the Sunday Run.
